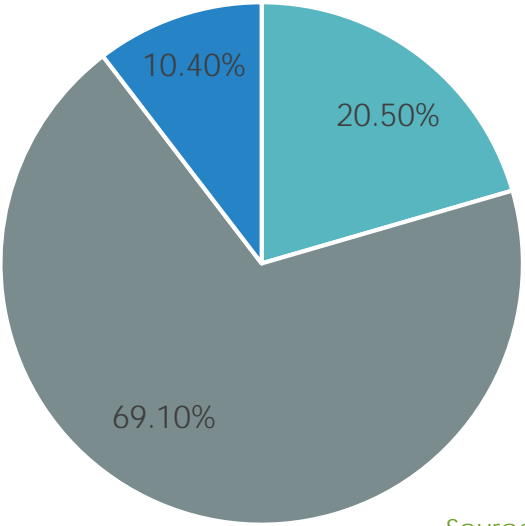

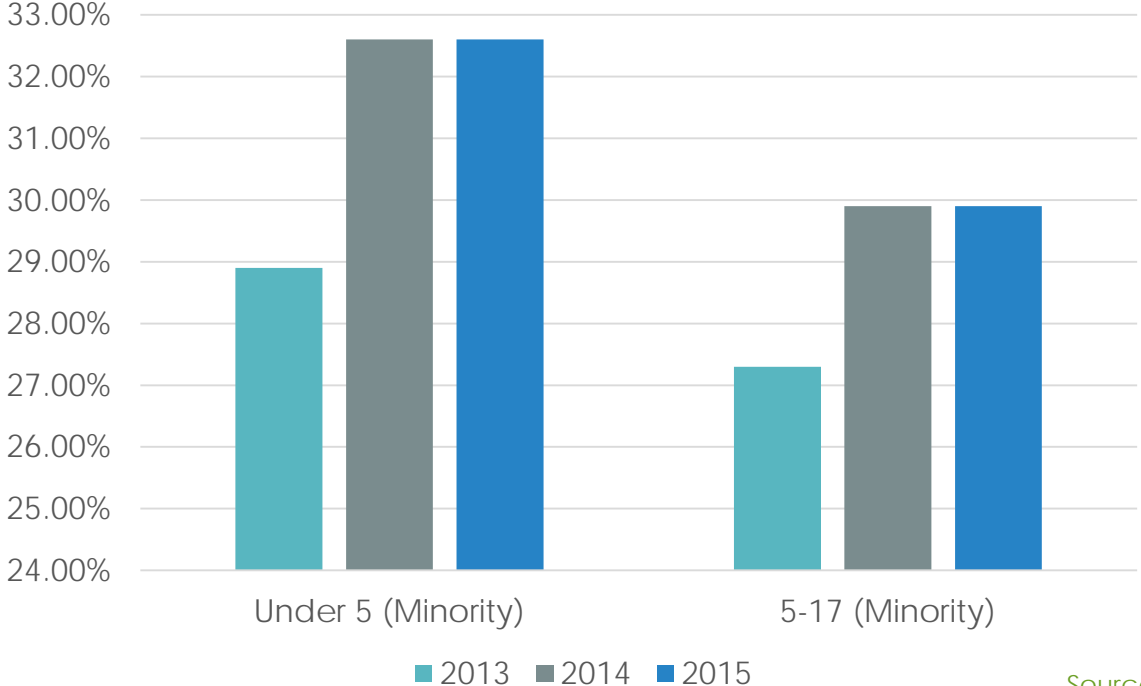
Population by Age Group

Population (Minority*)

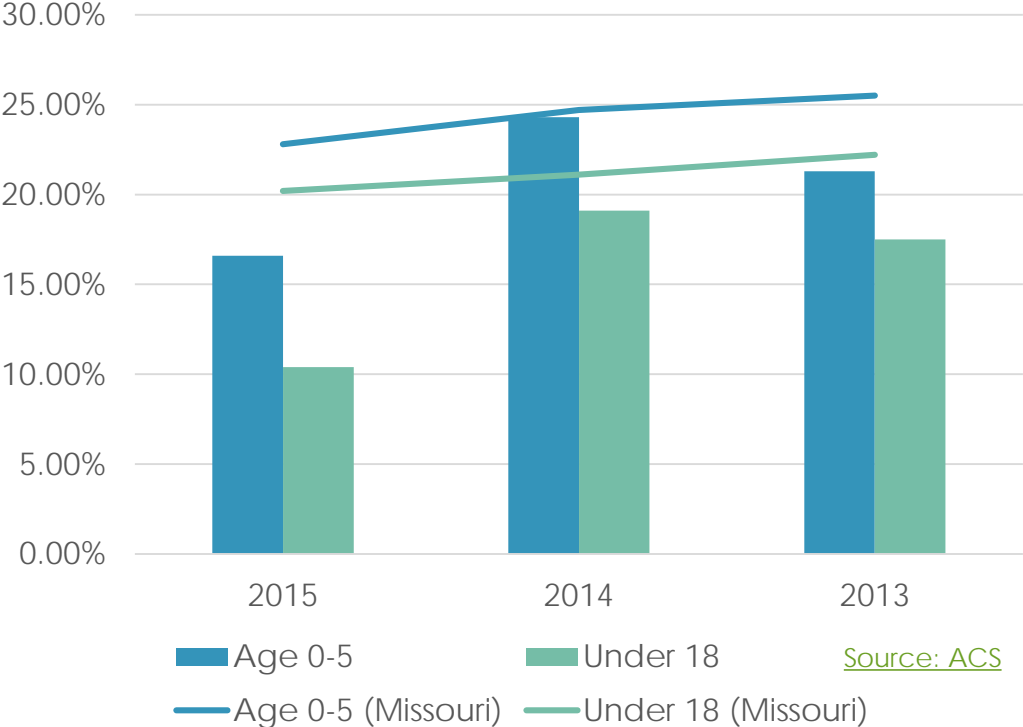

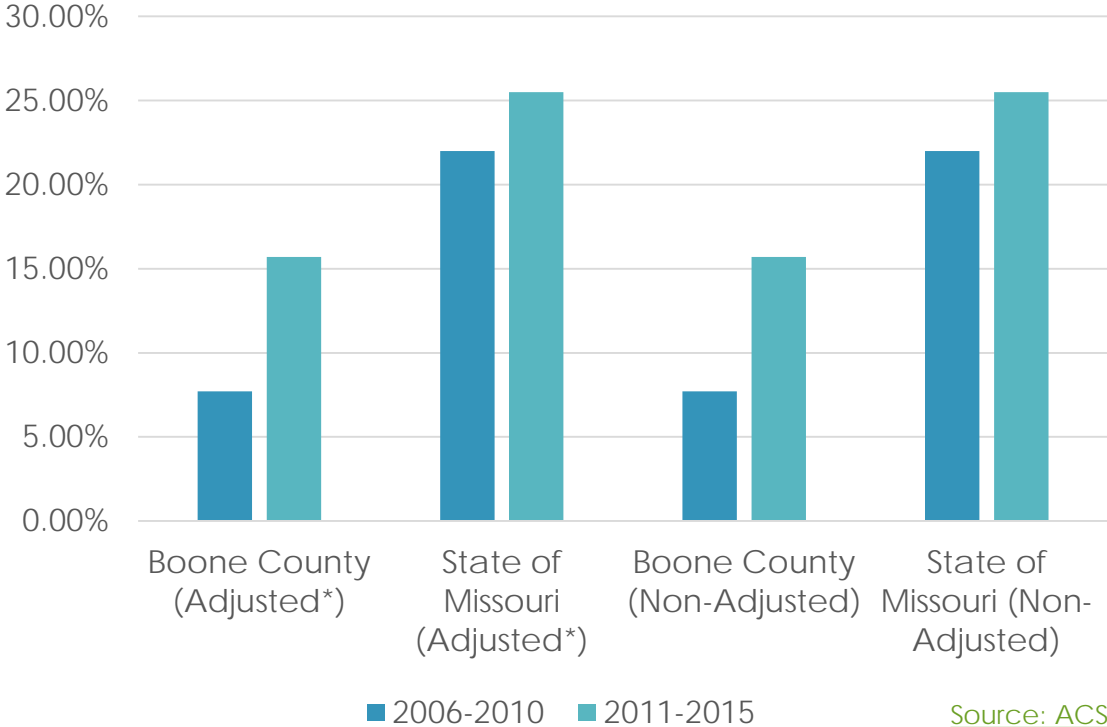

Boone County Child Poverty Rate (2013-2015)



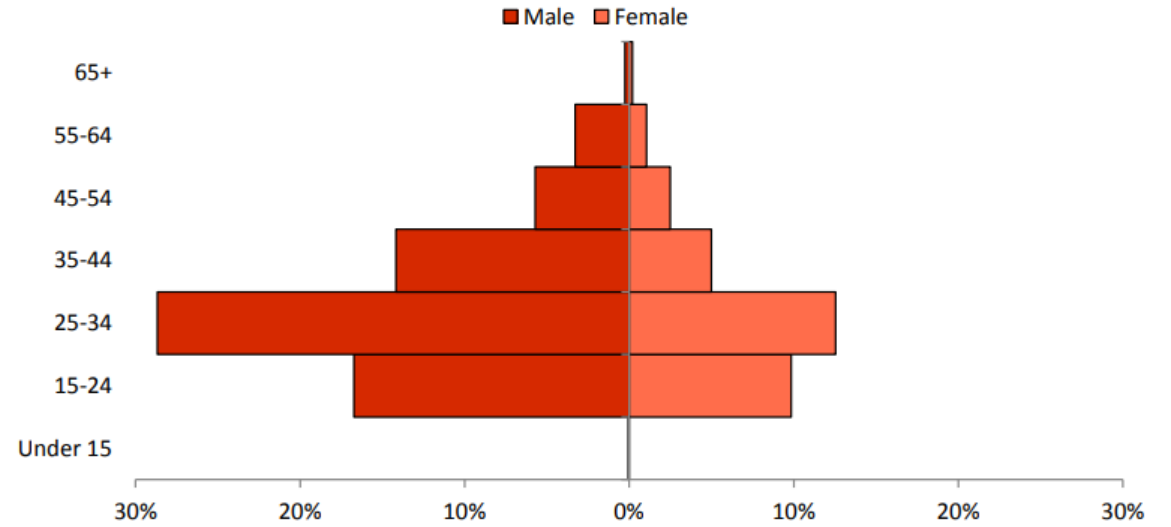
Children Living in Neighborhoods with Poverty Rate Higher than 30%



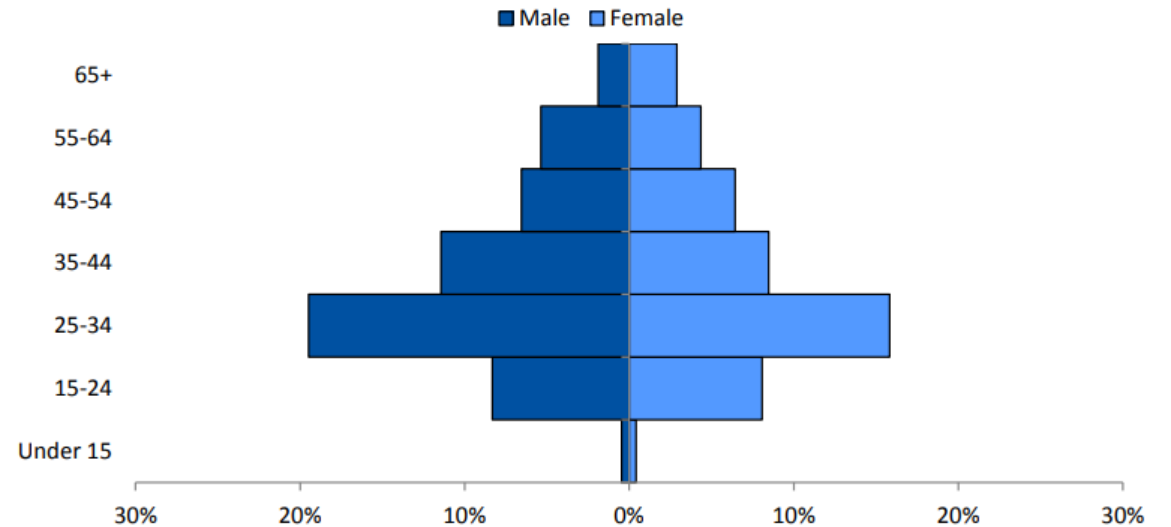

Missouri Resident Emergency Room Non-Heroin Opioid Discharges 2015

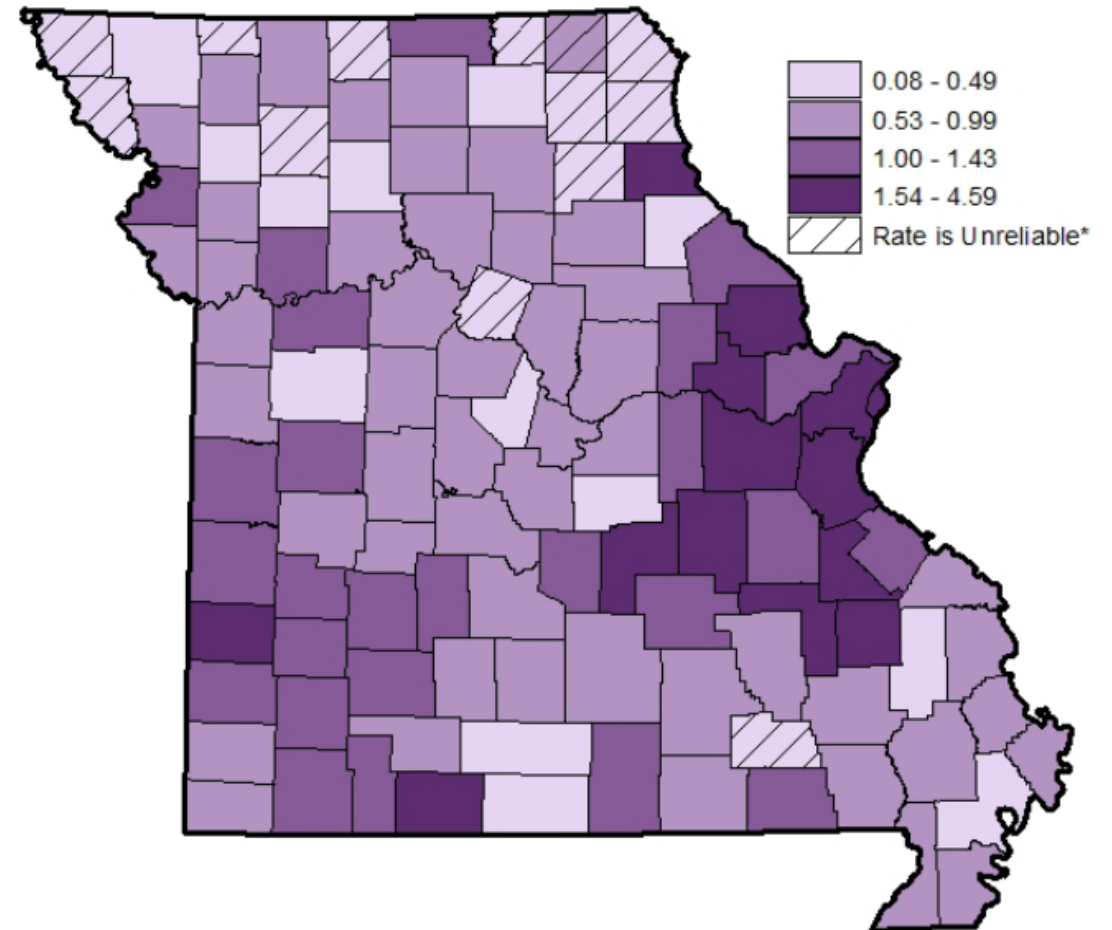

2012-2016



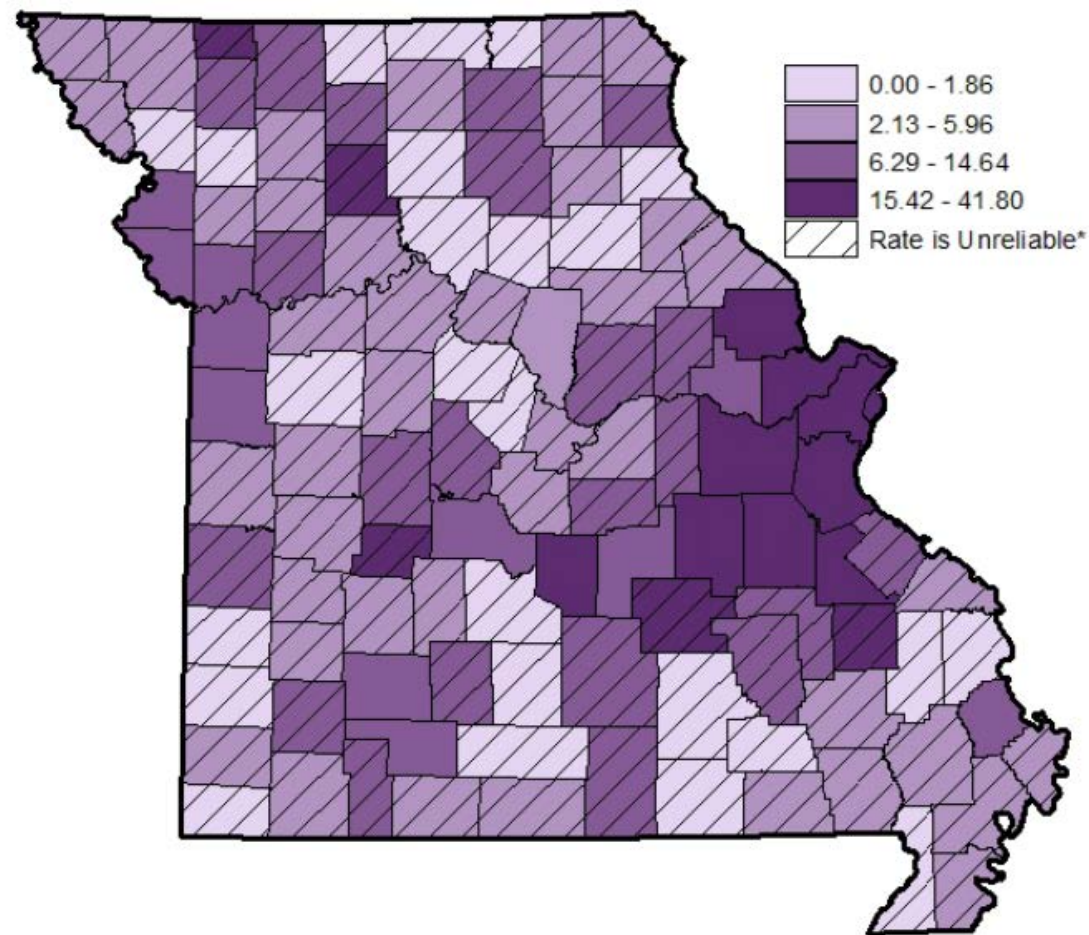

Deaths Due to Opioid Overdoses 2013-2017

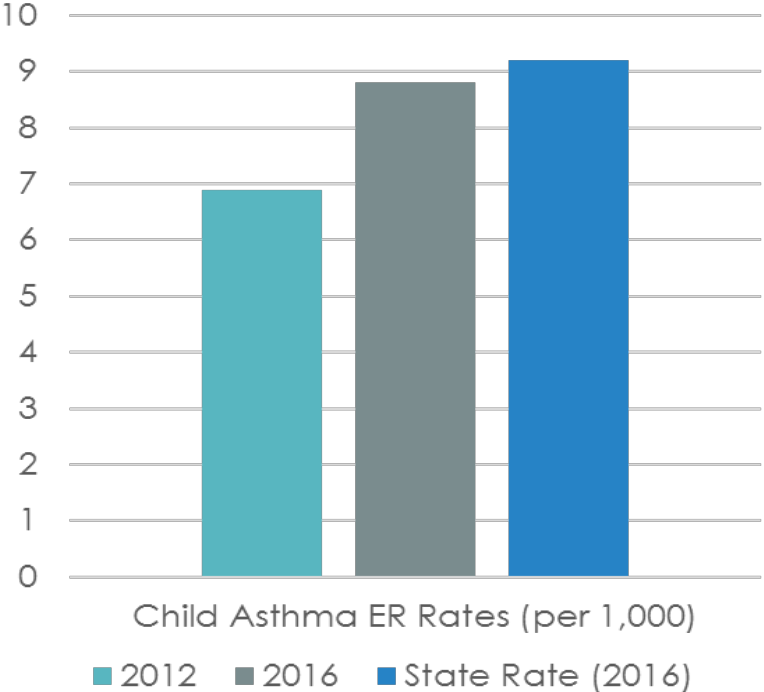

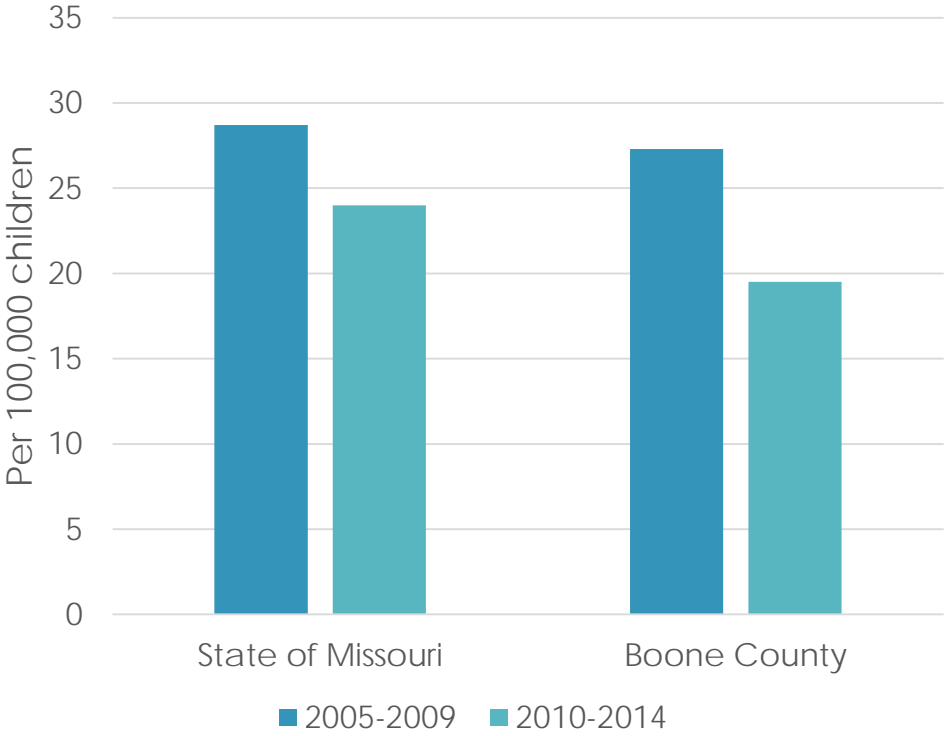

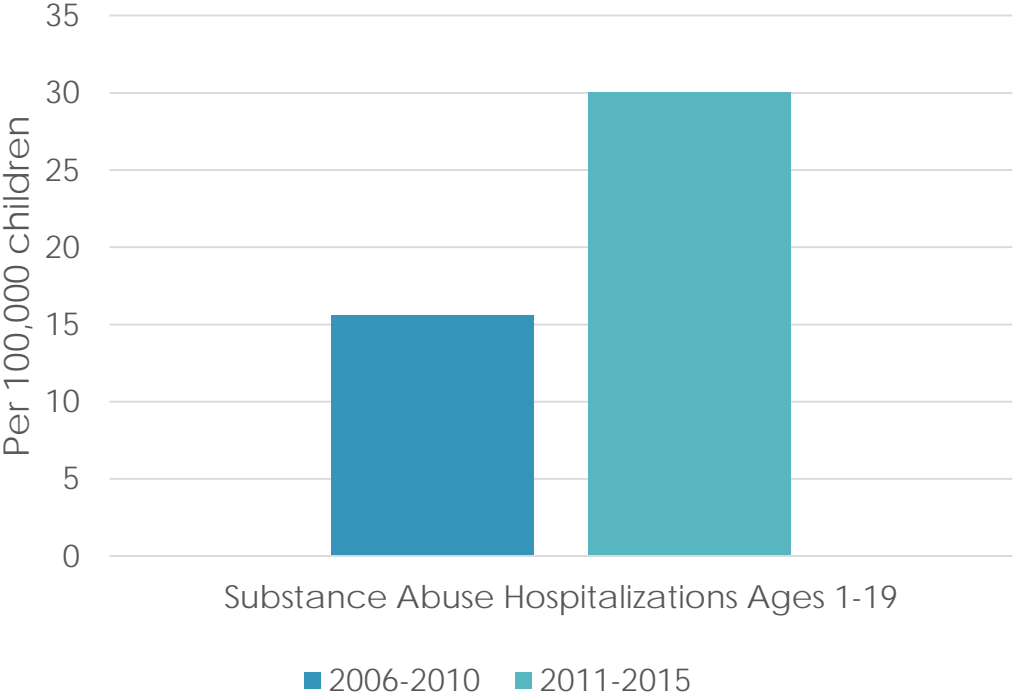
Child Mortality (Ages 1-17)

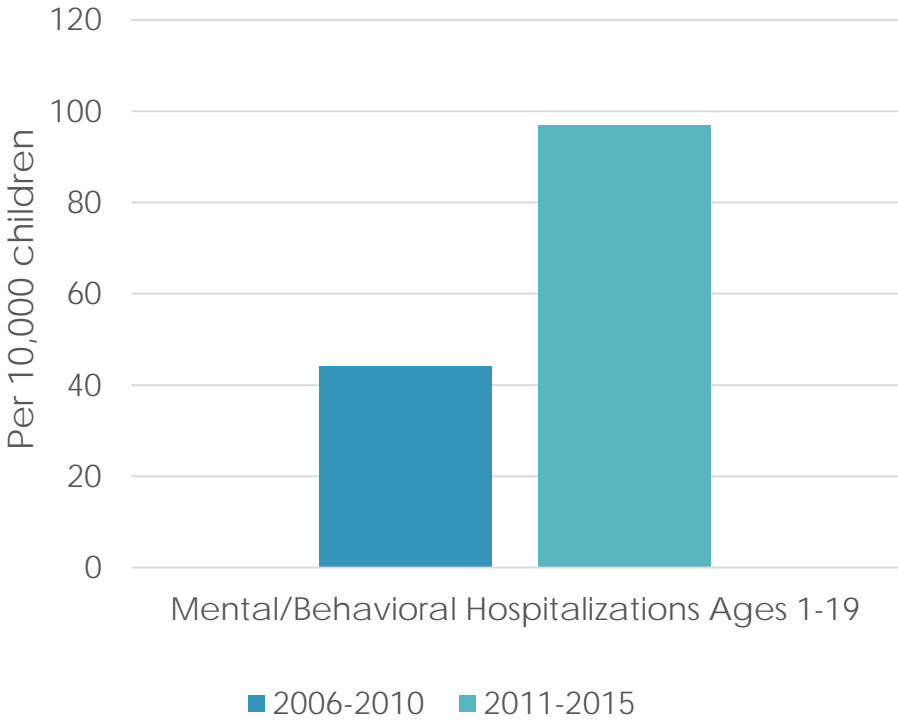
Boone County Child Health Indicators (Kids Count)

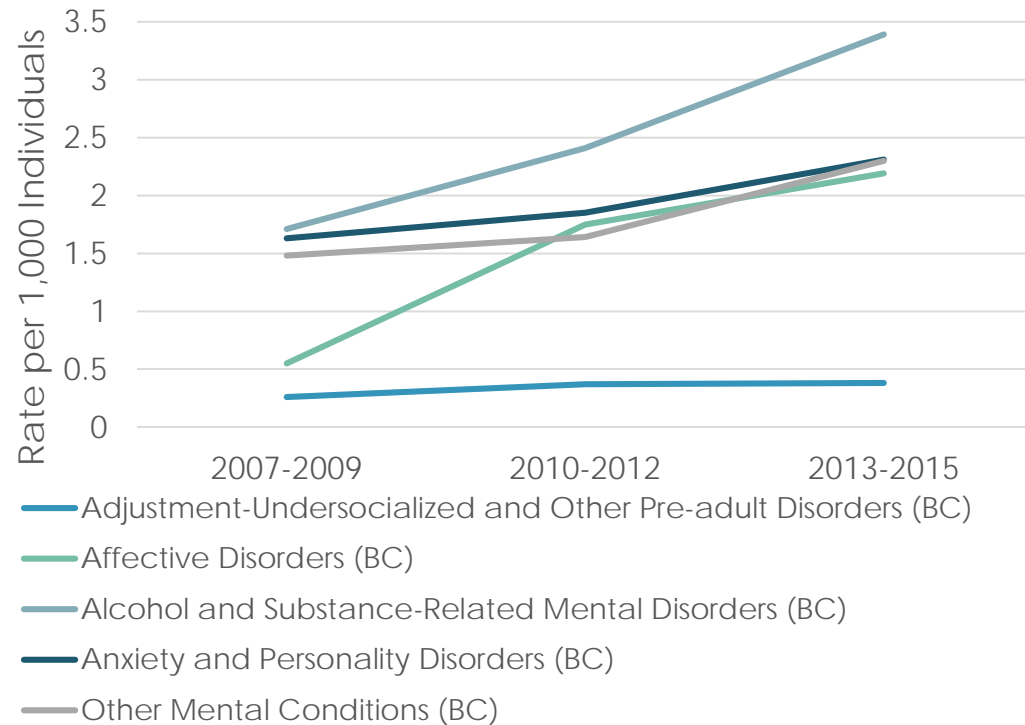
Mental/Behavioral Hospitalizations (not substance abuse) Ages 1-19



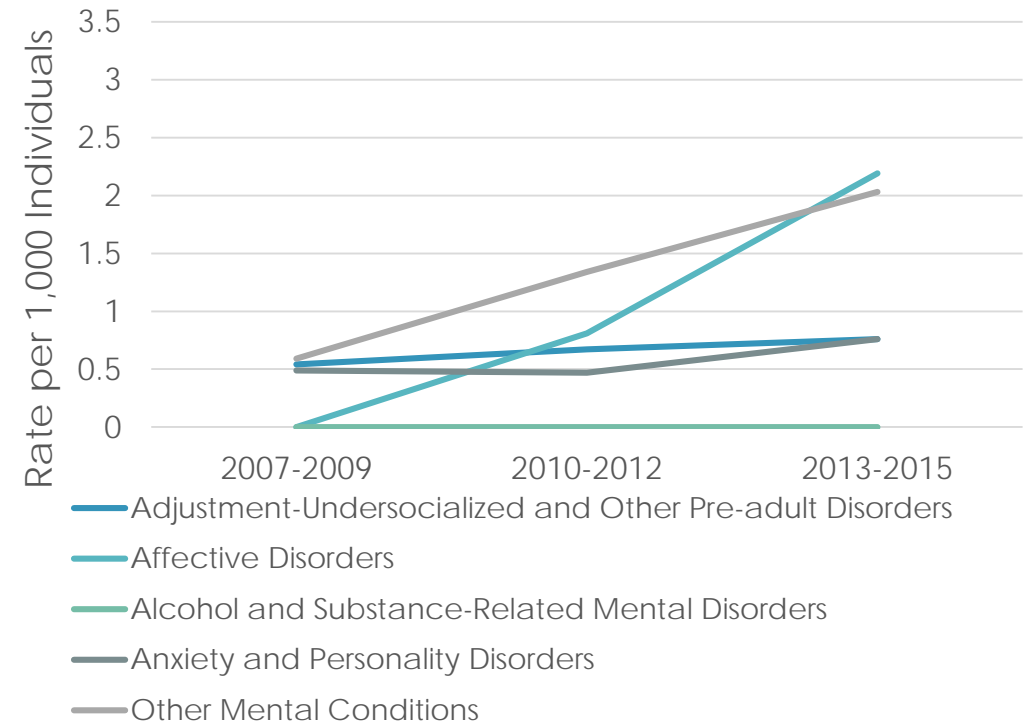

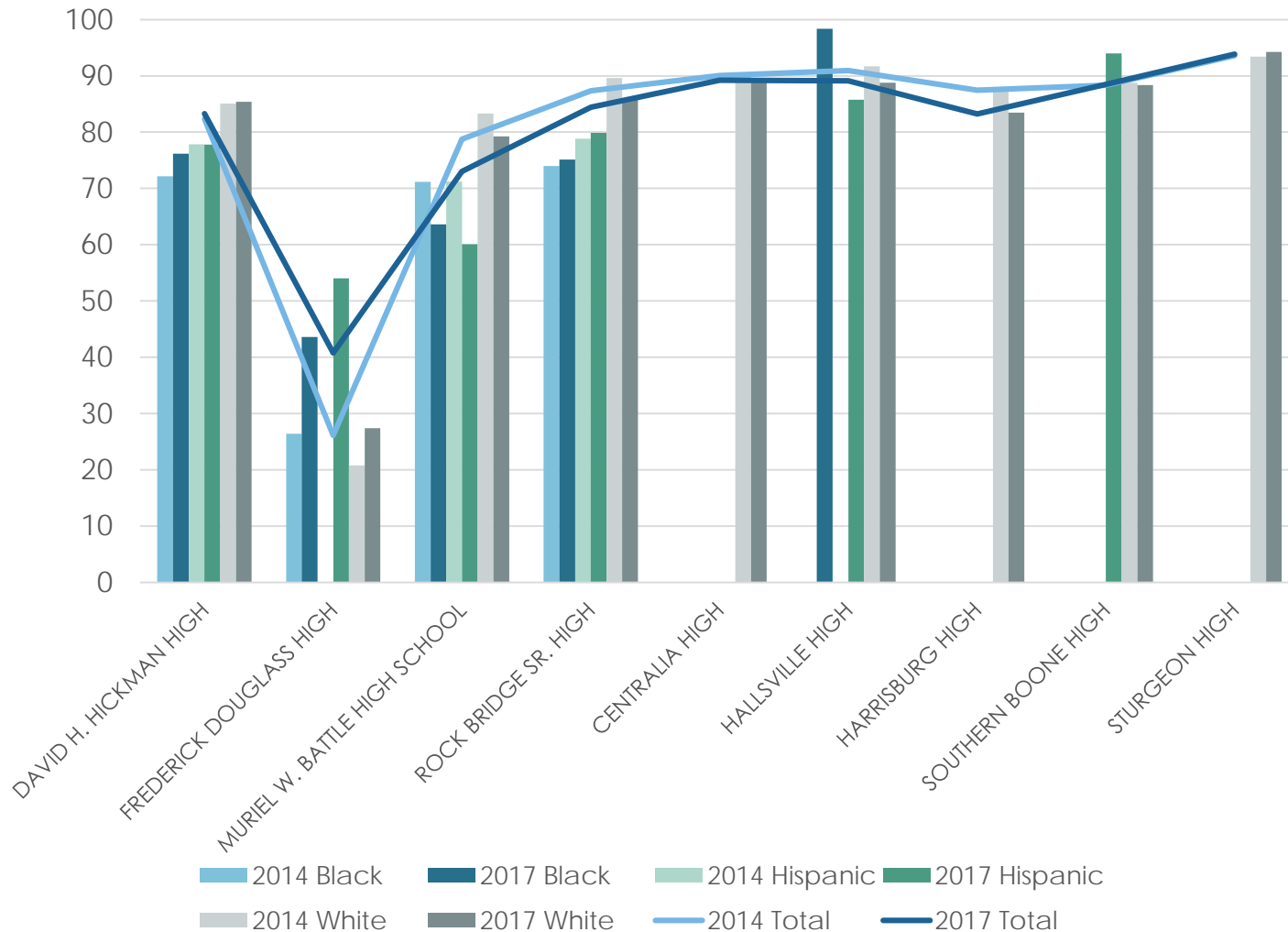
Boone County Youth Mental Health Rate (Up to Age 24)

Boone County High Schools Attendance Rates by Race (2014 & 2017)

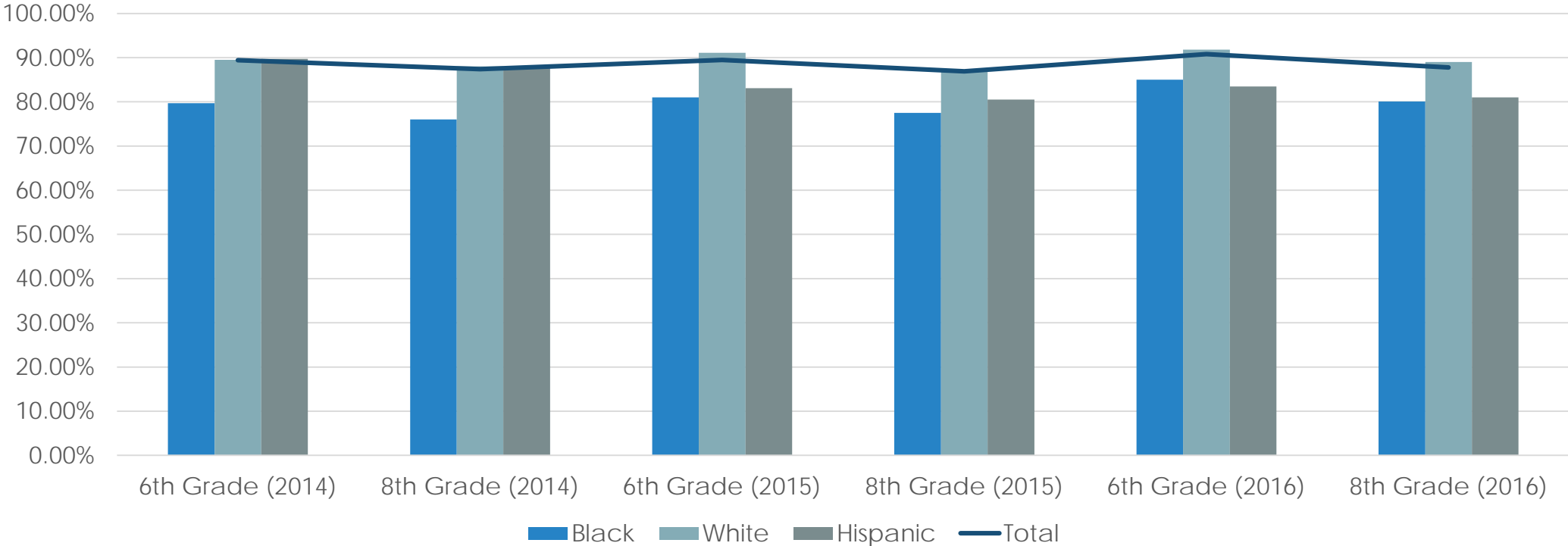

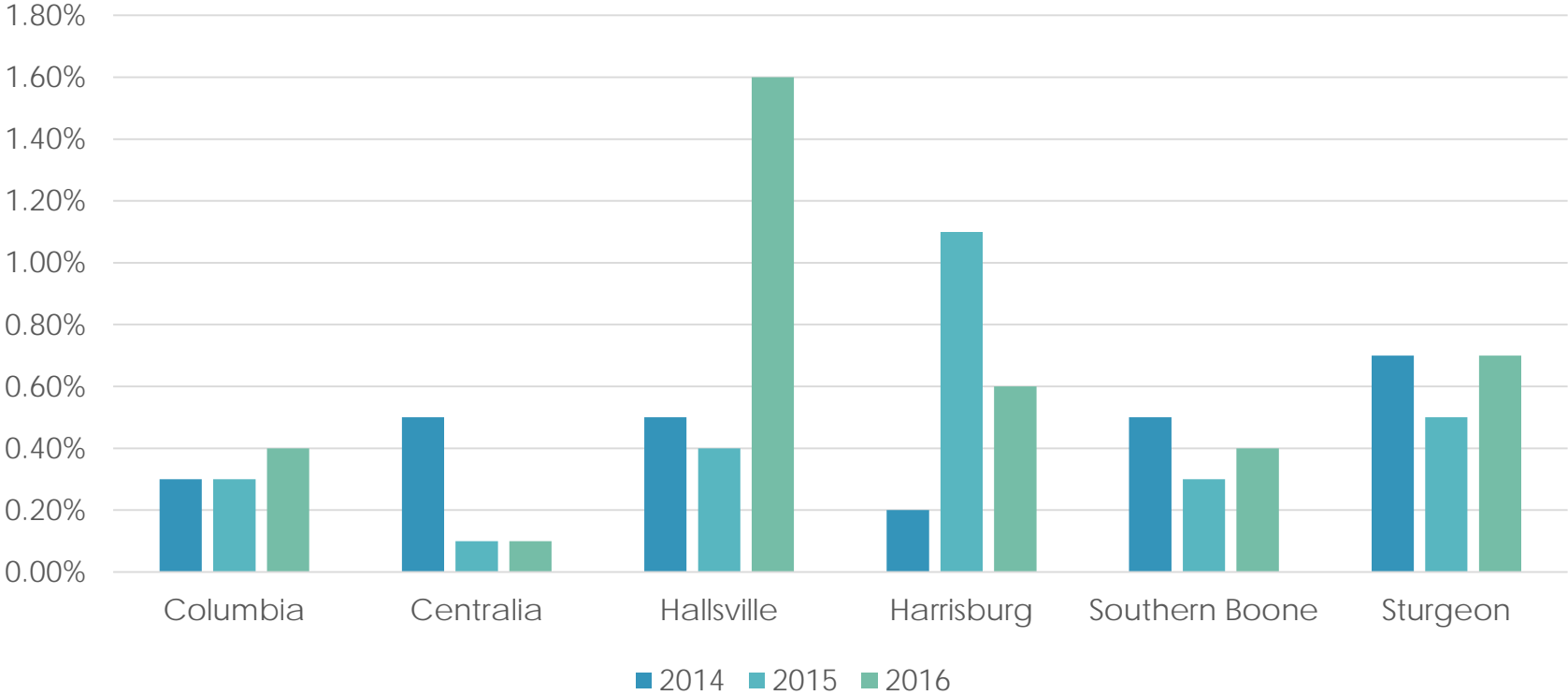
School Attendance: % of Students Attending at Least 90% of School Days (Columbia Public Schools)

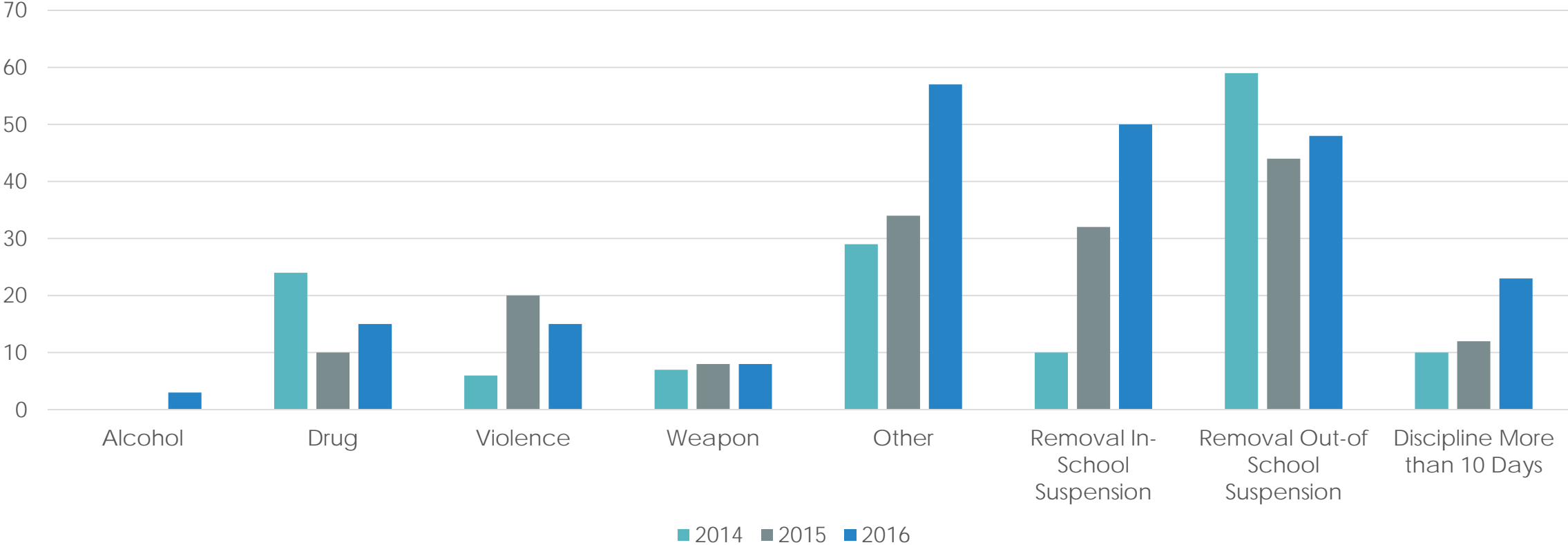
School Discipline Rates by District (K-12)

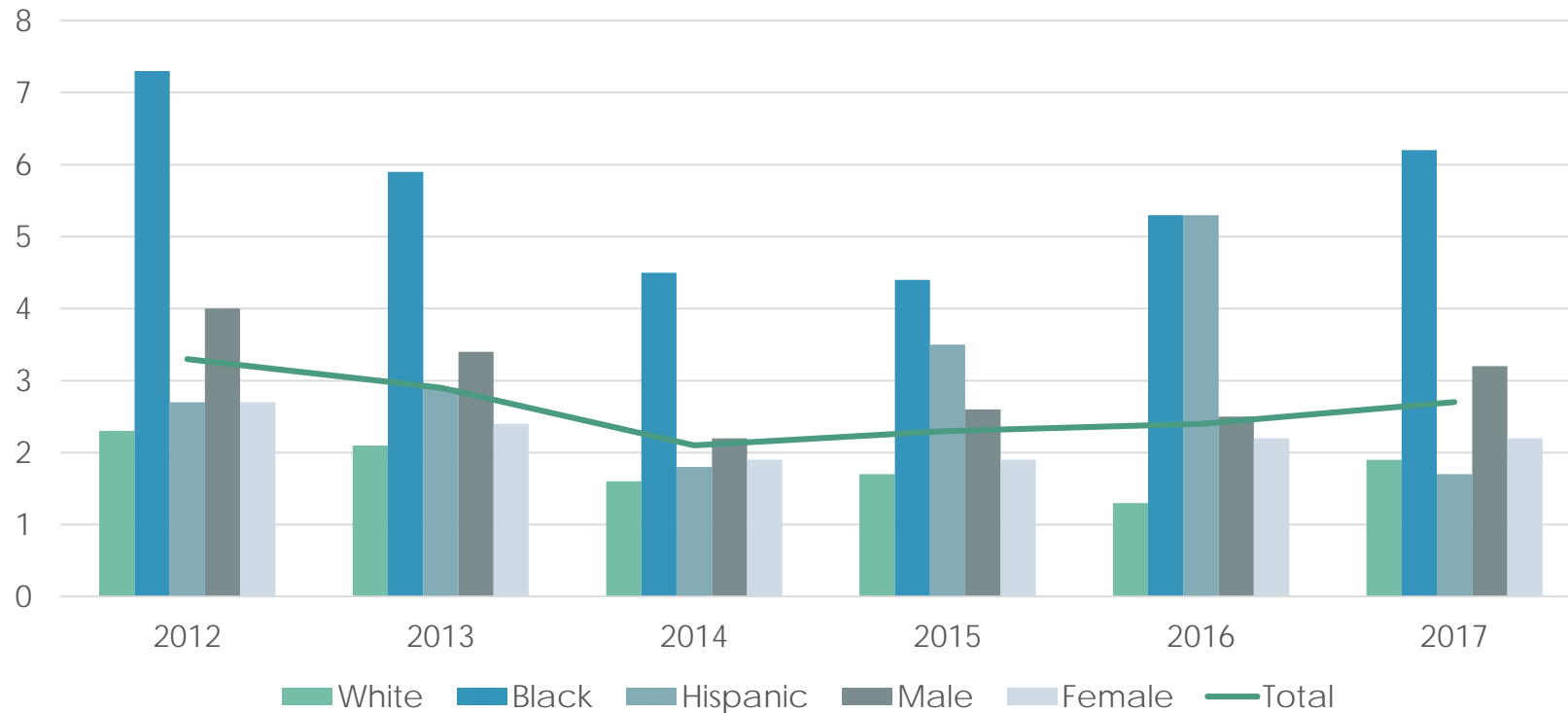
Number of Discipline Incidents for Boone County Schools

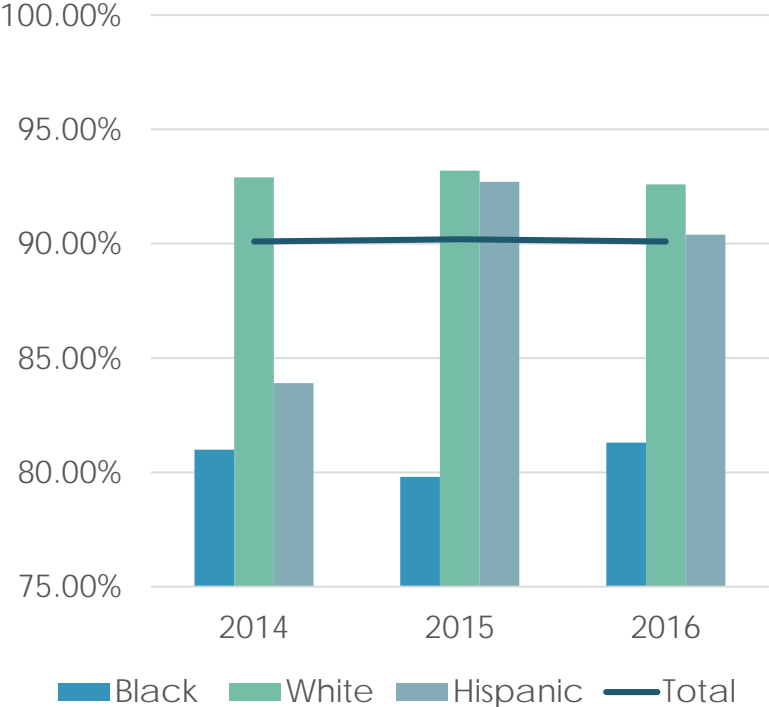

Columbia Public Schools Drop Out Rate (2012-2017)



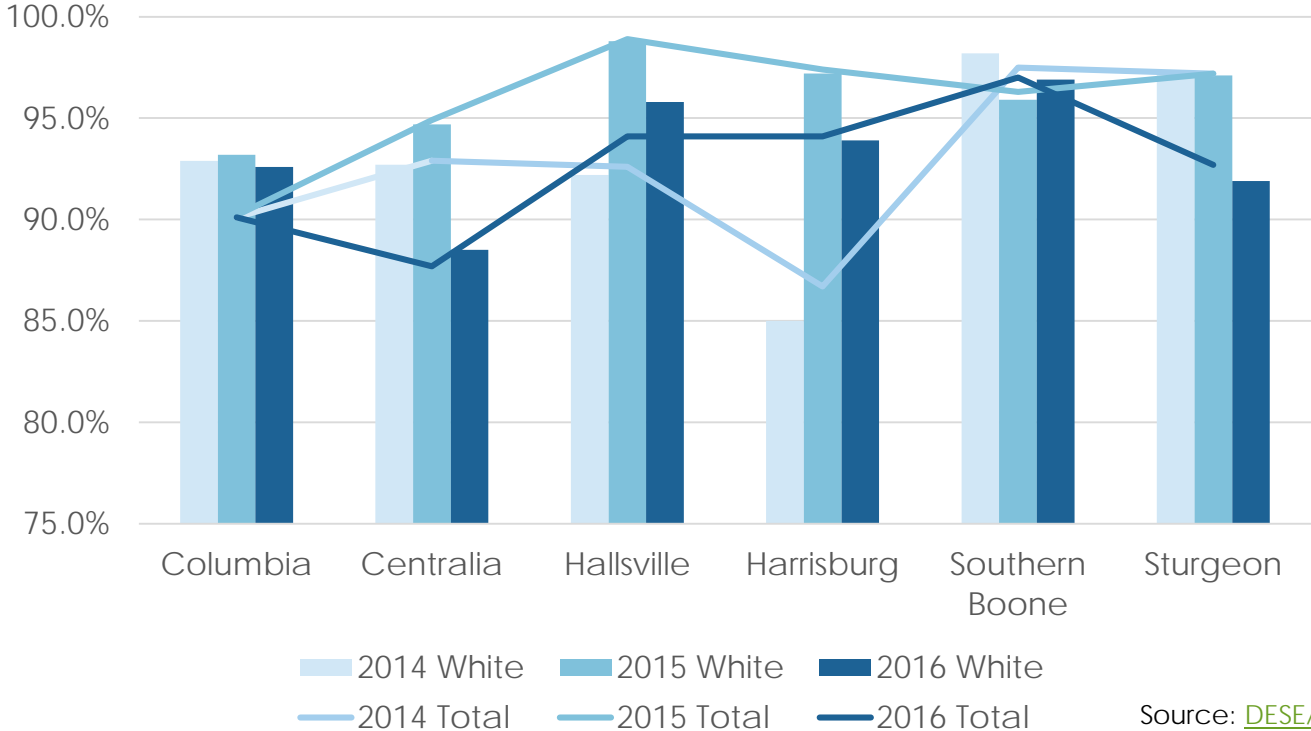

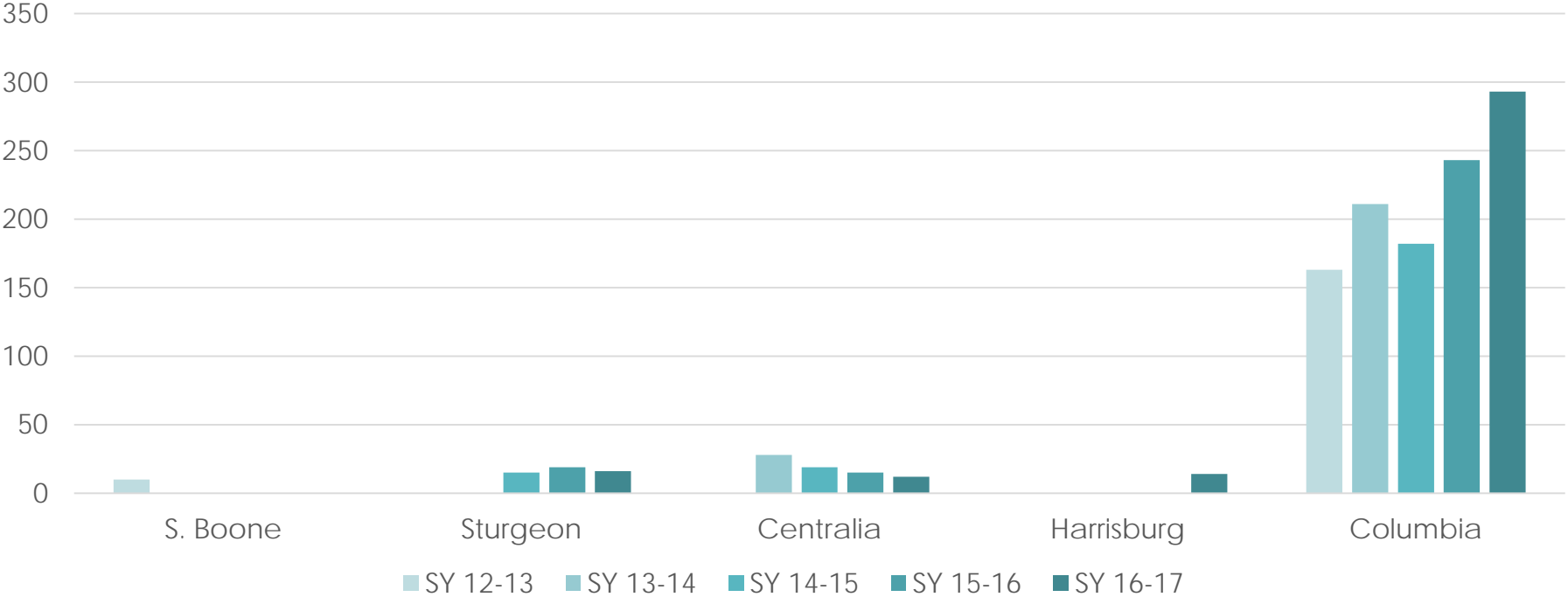
High School Graduation Rate by School District (Adjusted 4 Years)

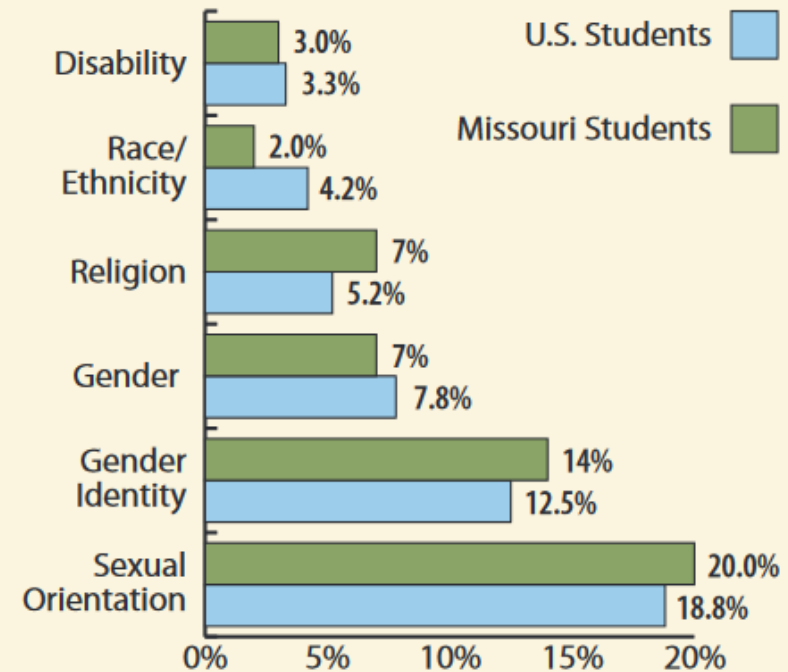
Boone County # of Unaccompanied Youth by School District

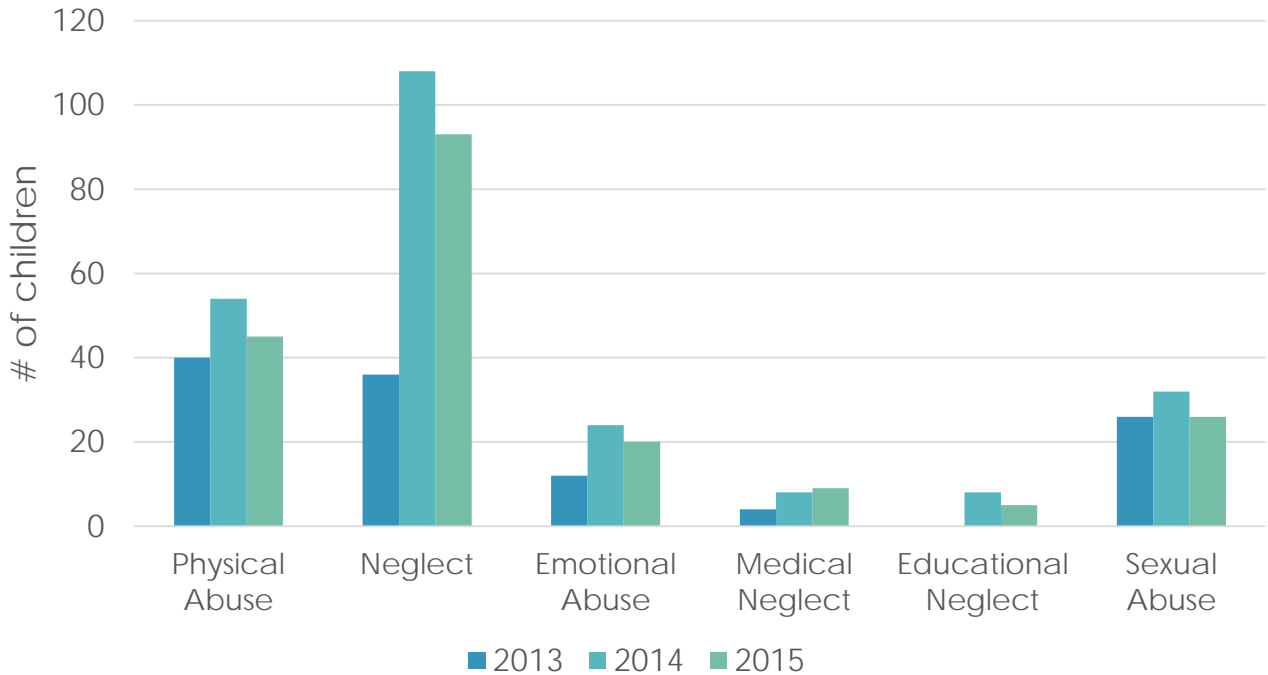

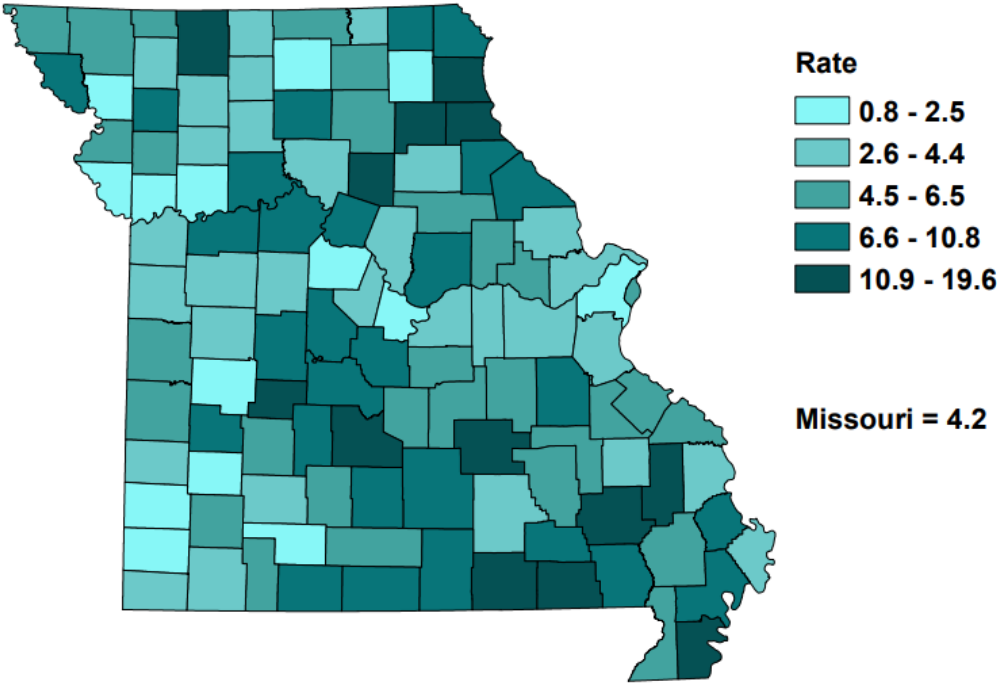
Child Abuse and Neglect in Boone County

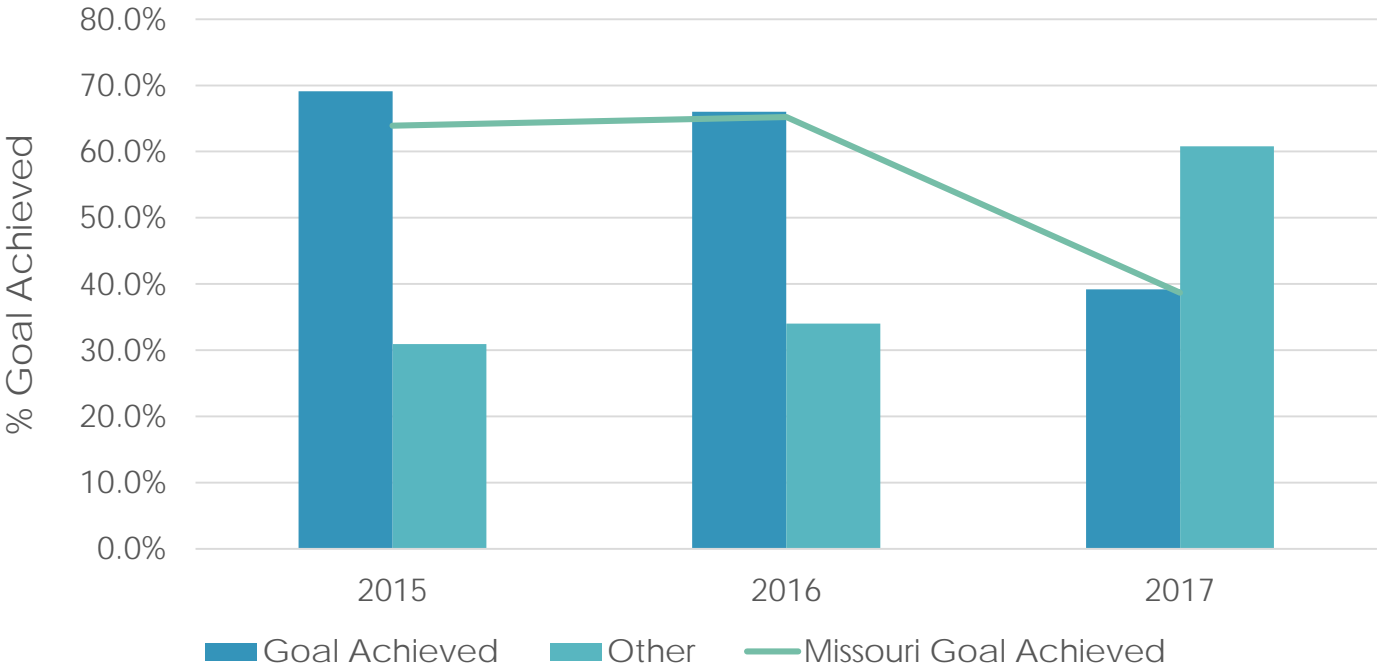
Substantiated Child Abuse/Neglect Cases (per 1,000) 2016

Family-Centered Services: Cases Closed and Reason for Closing (Boone County)



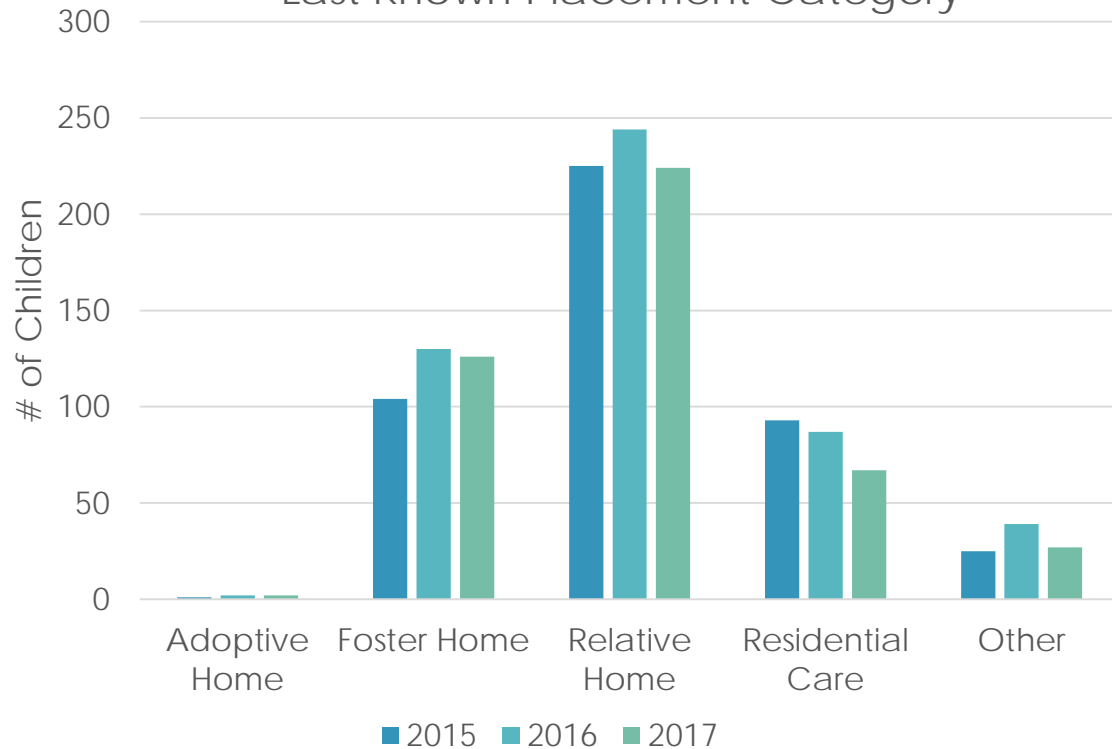
Close reason of "Goal Achieved" includes the following: Function plan achieved and/or the reasons for needed services no longer exist, all contracted services completed and risk factors are sufficiently reduced, case goals have been achieved, services can be provided by other resource without intervention of the Division and family can/will access such resources, no child under age 18 is still in the home.

Close reason of "Other" includes the following: Client not making progress but there is no legal grounds for court intervention, Client moved, unable to locate, Client moved, other state notified, Referred to other appropriate resource, Automatic closings due to policy change.

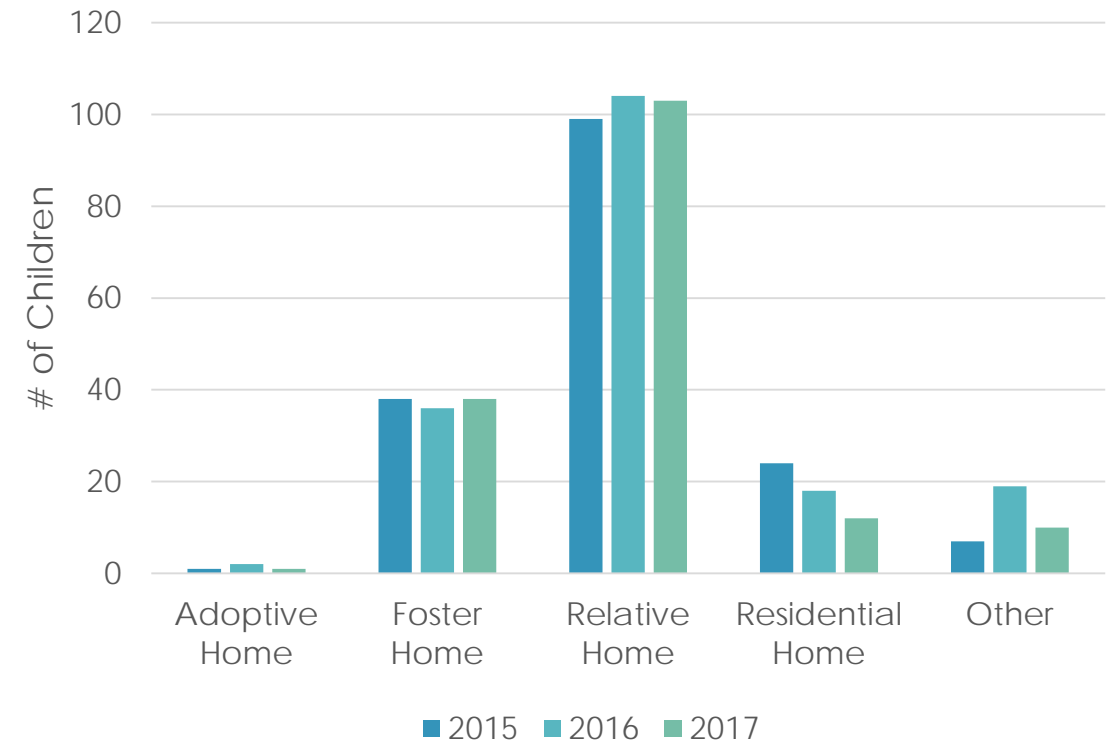

Children's Division: Out-of-Home Placements

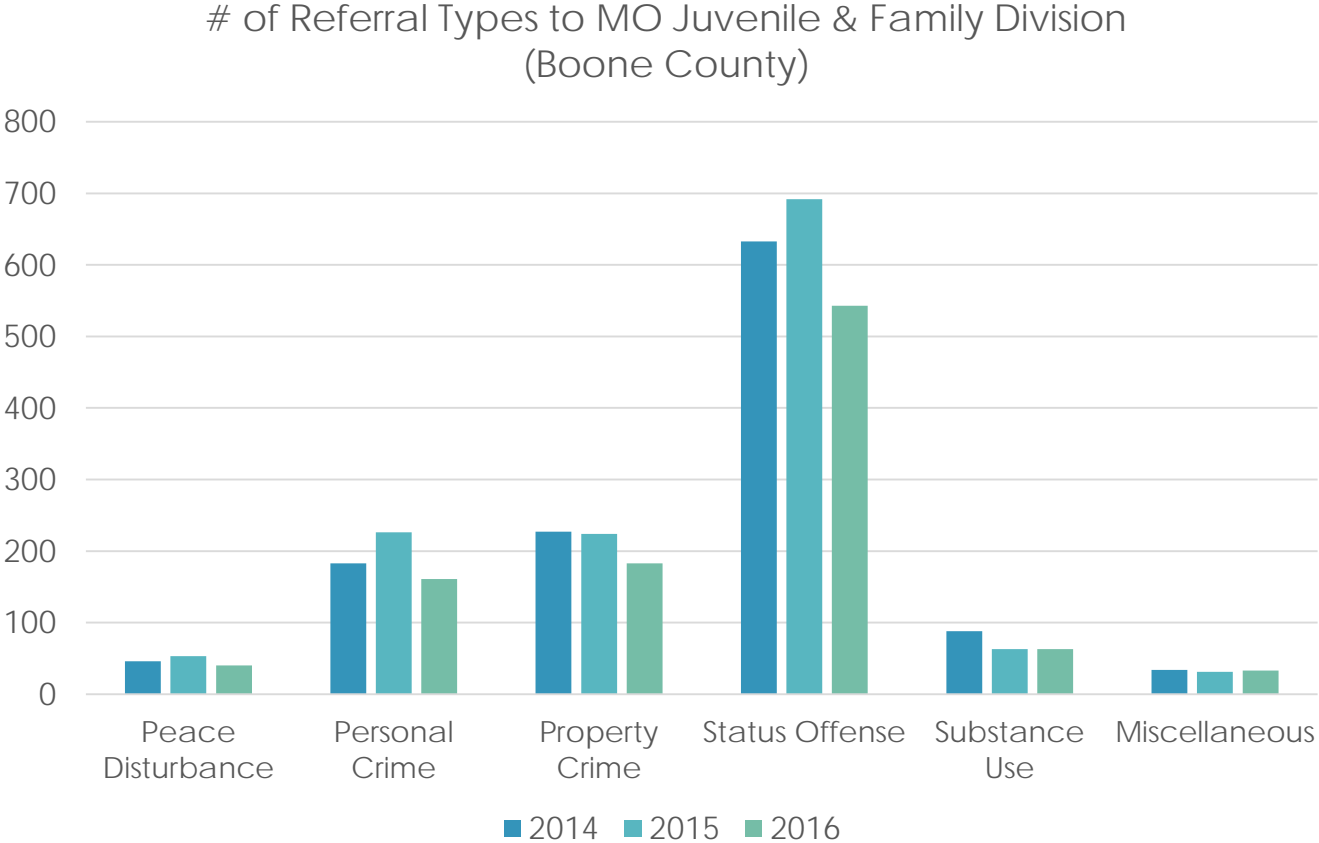
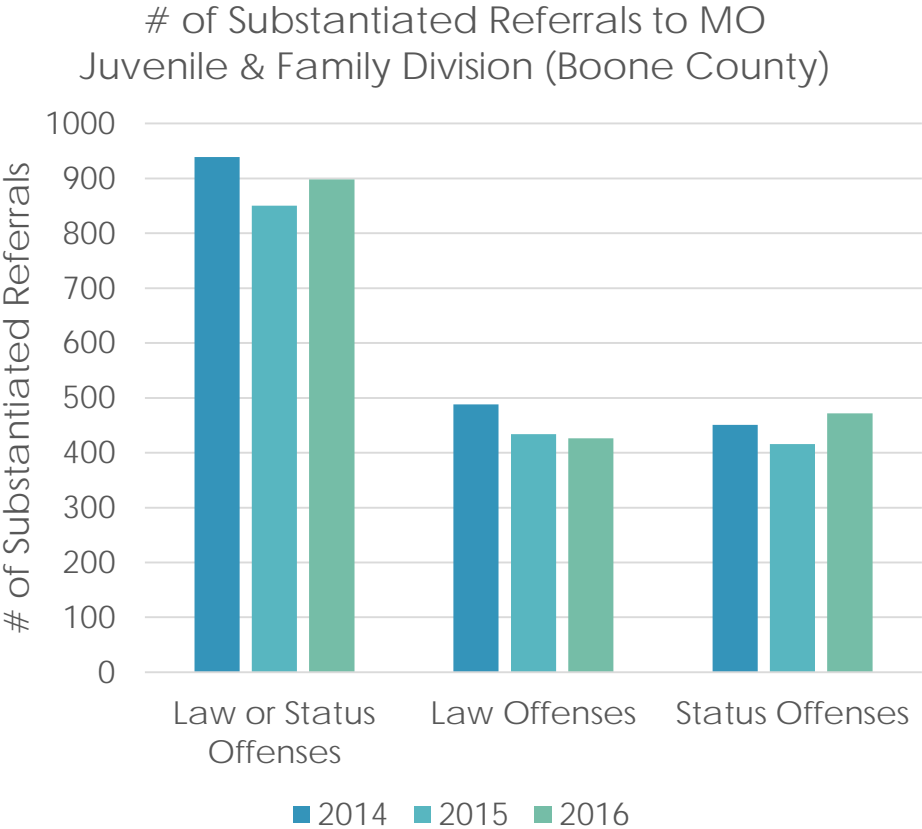
Boone County Out-of-Home Placements:
